LIVING BREAD: Why did Christ speak of himself as living bread? Why did he choose bread to transform into himself? Why didn't he take something much more precious, a diamond, perhaps, and change it into himself? Surely it would have been a very good symbol of his own precious nature. There are several reasons. One is Christ's generosity. He did not want to give himself only to a chosen few; he wanted to offer himself to everybody, and diamonds are only the possession of a few. Where could the poor obtain them? Or the priests suffering persecution as in the concentration camps of the last great war?

Bread is obtainable all over the world and thus Christ makes himself available everywhere provided a priest is present. But another and more impressive reason is bread itself. It is food and thus gives strength and comfort to all. Christ wanted to be closely united to all believers. *Abide in my love*, he said. What better way than of bringing about this union could there be than becoming the food of our souls? Just as bread is the staff of life for the body, so Christ would become the life of the spirit. By this Living Bread we would be transformed into Christ.

In today's Gospel, Our Lord compares the two kinds of bread; the bread provided by God to feed the Israelites in the desert and the Living Bread given to humanity. He points out that the former will only satisfy for a time and only sustain life for a while. After eating it, people will hunger again and will finally die. But those who eat the latter will never hunger because the life it gives will last for ever. The Gospel demands great faith on our part. Faith, says St. Paul is: *The evidence of things that appear not*. There is no difference to the eye between the bread that sustains the body and the Living Bread which came down from Heaven. But we who have faith see beyond the other appearance and have the vision of

Christ, Our Saviour, who has given himself to us in this wonderful manner. We should add our voices then to those of the people in the Gospel: *Lord give us this bread always*.

Closure of Churches due to the recent spread of the Corona virus.

As from 6pm on Saturday, 26th June 2021, Greater Sydney (which includes the Blue Mountains, Central Coast, Wollongong, and Shellharbour) is in lockdown until Saturday, 28th August at 12.01am. Consequently, the Church is closed until further notice.

However, funerals are permitted with a limit of 10 attendees.

Weddings, however, are not permitted.

Baptisms are not permitted, except in case of emergency. Similarly, the anointing of the sick, and sick calls generally, are permitted in case of emergency only.

It seems clear that, because the new Delta strain of Covid virus is so infectious, we are being asked to be even more cautious than during the previous lockdown. "Stay home" means "avoid all unnecessary contact with other people."

During the lockdown, the Sunday Mass will be live streamed on YouTube, and you are encouraged to connect prayerfully to this medium. The streaming will begin at 5pm on Saturday and can be accessed at any time after the Mass has concluded.
