THE PROMISE OF LIFE: Part of the fascination of the words of Our Lord is that they promise life and have the power to give it. His words are like no other words in that they are loaded with grace and, if accepted have a transforming quality. They make life worth living because they impart a wholeness, a fullness, and abundance to it. They promise a life beyond a life. "I have come that they may have life and have it more abundantly", he said. In today's Gospel he tells us "I give eternal life to the sheep that belong to me". Without Christ life tends to take on animal form. He is the key to human existence and the reason why it exists at all. "I am the Resurrection and the Life", he said. What is dead, meaningless, and unproductive becomes alive, fruitful and significant in him.

It is not simply that his words give a promise of the future, but they give eternal life now. A superhuman power is imparted by them; a power which can indeed impel a man across the grave to a new and finer existence but which, at the same time, gives to his present life a glory and a splendour beyond human comprehension because it is a sharing in the life of God. He can now say with St. Paul "I no longer live, but Christ Jesus lives within me". The power of Christ envelops him – not that he loses his identity, his personality but that it is caught up in the life of Christ in such a way that they become one, not in identity, but in unity of purpose and love. St. Thomas More in the tower of London wrote "The sayings of Our Saviour Jesus Christ were not a poet's fable nor a harper's song but the very holy word of Almighty God himself". This is what gives them such power; all the might of God is contained in them. Our part is to respond to them and this we do when we try our best to live in accordance with their teaching and exhortation.
