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# 18th April 2021 – Third Sunday of Easter

CHANGE OF HEART: Laws, as we all know do not of themselves create good living. The more laws there are, the greater the likelihood that they will be broken. The true approach to good conduct is through the right motivation. Christ condemned the Pharisees for their multiplication of petty regulations pointing out that what was far more important was the motives of peoples' hearts. There is much talk today about the secular and permissive society. People say that we are living in lawless days when in fact we are living with so many laws that we are in a "nanny state" and that we are encouraged to find loopholes in them. What is needed is not more laws but a national change of heart.

Can people change their attitude? Only if there is a greater incentive for them to do so. Great personalities have often brought this about either for good or evil. Certainly, Adolf Hitler brought a change in many a young man's view of life and its purpose; but no one has had a greater influence on people's lives than the one who died on a cross and rose on the first Easter morning. His teaching and example have brought about an immense change of heart. In today's Gospel, Christ said to his apostles before he returned to his Father: Thus it is written that the Christ should suffer and on the third day rise form the dead, and that repentance and forgiveness of sins should be preached in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. This repentance or metanoia, which means a change of heart, should bring about a spiritual and moral renewal in all our lives. This change will be brought about through Christ. Love is the most powerful force in the world for bringing out what is best in people. Our faith should make us realise the overwhelming love of God for us as shown in the life, death, and resurrection of Christ. If we really believe, in the full sense of that word, that God did all this for us, a change of heart is inevitable in our lives.

**Parish 2020 – A Call for Renewal** On the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe, 12<sup>th</sup> December, 2020, Archbishop Anthony Fisher launched our new Archdiocesan Mission Plan *Go Make Disciples* which, with the assistance of the Sydney Centre for Evangelisation, seeks to inspire and support the renewal of our parishes as places of encounter with the living Christ for the faithful and beyond.

In the weeks and months ahead, we will all join together in prayer, calling on the Holy Spirit, to prepare the hearts of each of us and of all our parishes and Eucharistic communities to receive anew the fire of God's love and the desire to be ever more faithful witnesses of Jesus Christ. A summary of the Mission Plan is available in the porch of the Church.

Imposition of restrictions concerning Churches: From Friday, 12<sup>th</sup> February, an unlimited number of people can attend Mass, provided that the one person per 2 metre square rule is observed. However, our Church will only hold at least eighty according to this regulation, any overflow would have to be accommodated in the Marion Hall where the Mass can be viewed on the TV monitor. Because of the easing of the restrictions, the Archbishop has lifted the dispensation from our Sunday Mass obligation. *Parishioners are once again obliged to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of obligation when this is reasonably possible.* Those of great age, have health conditions or are otherwise anxious about the risks of Covid19 are free to remain at home and find another way of keeping the Sabbath holy. There is still the requirement of taking names and contact details of attendees. The use of a QR code is recommended for those with iPhones or smart phones. The NSW Services app would need to be install on your phone to access the code. The first time you use the code, it will ask you to provide your name and contact number. It will then send you a code to enter with your details and the app will then be active. It is then used every time you attend Mass, or when and where you visit other venues that have a QR code registration system in place.

The wearing of masks is no longer mandatory, but strongly recommended where social distancing is not possible. They are, however, still mandatory when travelling on public transport.

Parishioners who elect to attend Mass during the pandemic should consider the safety of other parishioners by staying away if they are unwell, and if so, getting tested and self-isolating while awaiting the results. It is also advisable that parishioners only attend Mass in their own parish and not move from parish to parish.

Confessions are now available before the 5 pm Vigil Mass (4 pm to 4.45 pm).
