A Hard Saying: No doubt there is much in Christian teaching that is hard to accept. It is much easier to say with the disciples, "This is intolerable language, who can listen to it", and then block one's ears to it. Christ never promised an easy passage to salvation. He spoke of a "narrow way" to it. What the disciples found difficult in the Gospel was Christ's teaching about himself as food and drink. But Christ is not blaming them for finding it difficult, nor for want of understanding of his teaching. Could anyone blame them for not grasping his meaning? It must have sounded almost completely unintelligible. What Christ was demanding was not understanding but faith in himself. After all these were his disciples. They knew him. They must have known him, unless blinded by prejudice, as a most wonderful person who spoke with complete sincerity and truth. They must have known of his claim to messiahship. Therefore they should have had faith in him. Their attitude should have been "though we don't understand we know what you are saying is the truth", instead, as the Gospel tells us "After this many of his disciples drew back and no longer went with him".

What happened then still happens today. There are those who find Christ's saying hard and because of their lack of faith no longer go along with him. The Christian may find many difficulties if accepting Christ's teaching but faith feeds on difficulties. It is for all of us to say with St. Peter "Lord to whom we shall go? You have the words of eternal life." We do not know the answers, but we do know where to go, not for the answers, but for the acceptance of truth.
