GOD WITHIN US: Bound up with the mystery of the life which Christ came to give us is the indwelling presence in us of the three divine persons. We cannot understand the way of their presence but we can know something of its results. An old battered violin may look useless and unsightly; it may lie in a shop for years because no one likes the look of it. But then perhaps one day a violin player enters the shop and takes the violin in his arms and plays upon it until the whole instrument become vibrant with beauty and sound. The violinist has discovered and brought out its worth, revealing its beauty which its outward looks belied.

So it is with God and man. The human person has little value – weak and ineffective and ugly with sin but one God takes hold and the blessed Trinity comes and dwells within, the person become vibrant with new life and a beauty of personality far beyond what the ordinary human nature manifests. Deep down in those regions of personality which the person cannot penetrate, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit perform their work of transformation.

The greatest power on earth is love. Without love we are no longer human. But when love is present, our lives are transformed. God is the source of all love. It is love that binds the persons of the Trinity in an eternal unity. It is this love of God within a human being that gives value, greatness and splendour beyond what human imagination can conceive. So great is this love of the Blessed Trinity that, in St. Peter's words, we become "partakers of the divine nature". We of ourselves could not approach God. But God's love for us was so great that he came to us and raised us up to share his life and glory.
